## **Costa Rica Tarpon Fishing (Anthony Reiss - OK)**

I would like to take a moment to comment on our trip this past month at a resort in Costa Rica. Outdoor Connection and Fish & Hunt The World did an excellent job of booking our trip. We arrived in San Jose at approximately 2:00 pm and hired a tour guide to show us the town. The next morning we flew to a small village where we were awaited by the resort staff. We boarded a pontoon boat and up the river we went to the lodge.

The lodge is built on the edge of the Rio Colorado in the middle of the rain forest. What an incredible place in the middle of the jungle. The staff, food and service were extremely good. The rooms were very roomy and most definitely comfortable. The morning we arrived we dropped off our gear, ate some breakfast and then headed out for tarpon. We boarded the boat and went about ten minutes down river to where the Rio Colorado and the Caribbean Sea meet. Once we were past the mouth of the river my eyes almost fell out of my head when I noticed hundreds of adult tarpon rolling everywhere. I immediately grabbed my fly rod and started whirling a fly towards the tarpon all around the boat. Within less than one minute a giant tarpon smashed my fly. The guide, Cliff started yelling " big tarpon " I set the hook on this monster and he immediately took off and snapped my rod in half. The 12 wt Sage rod was brand new and broken. The fish was still on the line and all I had was a stub of a rod and my Abel reel. You can probably guess the rest of the story. However; there were still hundreds of tarpon all around us. Two minutes later my brother, Chris Reiss hooked into and landed

I eventually landed a 130 lb tarpon along with countless others that were above the 100lb mark. My son and father were fishing together and between the two of them they landed over 2,000 lbs of tarpon in 4 days. The largest being 180lbs on conventional tackle.

Since it was my first hunt, Tracey also let me take the first shot. OK, actually she had to walk me through it a little bit so I wouldn't freak out. Here's the thing: I don't take this "killing a living creature" thing lightly and I wanted to ensure that I had a humane kill. I also wanted to get one that would provide me with good meat to eat. I only support hunting for sustenance and fortunately the majority of hunters are the same way.

In any case, I lined up my shot, took a deep breath, and after I had let all the air out squeezed the trigger and BAM...I got one! Although I was shaking from all the adrenaline and freaked out because the hog I got ran for about five seconds before toppling over, I was also happy to have gotten one! My first hunt ever and I got a hog on the first night!

When the guides came by to pick us up just after nightfall, we brought the hog (which turned out to be a boar) back with us and the guys weighed it and field dressed it. And they also soon told me it was, in fact, a humane kill. Whew!

Although I realize that field dressing is something I'll eventually have to learn, I left it to the experts this time.

The rest of the weekend was, in a word, fabulous. I immediately felt like "one of the huntresses" with my very own hunting success story and despite the 4:30am alarm clock looming above us the next morning, we happily ate, drank and told stories late into the night. The next day Katherine, who I've decided is my sister from another mister *and* one of the first women I will call when the zombie apocalypse happen, and I got to do a little horseback riding with the guides. We were riding in search for hogs, but we only saw traces of them. Oh well, we both had a blast and looked awesome while doing it.

Although only Kirstie also ended up getting a hog, I think we were all happy by the time Sunday afternoon hit and we were all packing up.

So ladies, if you're interested in trying out hunting for the first time - definitely consider an all female hunt.
